## **Updating names, pronouns, and recording legal name changes:**

Students can manage how their names appear in College communications and indicate their pronouns. Below are directions for ensuring your name appears as you like, both with and without a legal name change. The forms can be found on the Registrar's webpage.

If you have completed a **legal name change**, please fill out the [Legal Name Change form](#).

You can **indicate the name you use without a legal name change**. Fill out the [First Name and Pronoun Designation form](#). The name and pronouns you designate will appear in the Student Evaluation System. Note that your legal name will remain connected to your campus record and will appear in certain places as required by law (e.g., official transcript).

Both of the forms above include an option to **request a new email address** that reflects your updated name. After your request is processed (1-2 business days), you can visit the Finance Office in Palmer Building D and **request a new ID card**. You are allowed one free new card to reflect your name change, and you must surrender your old card.

### **You can change how your name appears in some campus systems without filing a request with the Registrar:**

**Canvas:** From the Help menu in Canvas, select Name Change and enter your first name. ETS will process your name change within 1-2 business days.

**Gmail display name:** Follow the instructions at [this link](#) to change your Gmail display name. Note that your email username will not be affected. You can also have Gmail [forward email automatically](#) from one account to another.

**Handshake:** Select the drop-down menu under your name and choose My Profile, then click the pencil icon near your name and photo to change your name.

## **On-Campus LGBTQ+ Support:**

### **Queery and T Party** | *See Organizations tab on Novoconnect*

Queery is New College's LGBTQ+ club that creates space for queer socialization, support, and activism. T Party is an inclusive club for trans students to connect, socialize, and support each other.

### **LGBTQ+ Programming and Activities** | *See Events tab on Novoconnect*

Annual LGBTQ+ and identity-affirming events on campus include Coming Out Day, Coming Out Monologues, Trans Day Of Remembrance, and more. Off campus, there are regular events such as Sarasota Pride and the Harvey Milk Festival.

### **The Gender and Diversity Center (GDC)** | *Located in HCL 001 (Ham Center)*

The GDC is a meeting place for student groups to work on social justice issues. The Center has many resources and is available for studying and impromptu meetings.

### **Pride Living Learning Community (Residence Hall)**

Pride LLC offers a living space and events/activities to foster support for LGBTQ people. You can apply to the LLC in the spring during the housing application process.
